In January of 2018 New Hope left our clinic building but continued to see patients at their offices on Main St. This was due to a change in their grant allocations. In the meantime, it gave the clinic an opportunity to restructure the clinic's conference room to better accommodate the counselors and the patients who would be returning to the Raphael clinic building in August of 2018. According to Americares, over 70% of all primary care visits are related to mental health issues. New Hope is a Christian counseling center that works with a variety of issues including grief and loss, anger management, ADD, parenting skills and much more. The patients and Raphael Community Free Clinic are happy with the outcome of this partnership.

The Raphael Community Free Clinic has been providing educational opportunities for future Family Nurse Practitioners (FNP) for several years. This year our clinic's FNP Jason has been supervising and teaching Charlize Newbell who commutes from San Antonio Monday through Thursday to achieve 180 college credit hours towards her FNP degree. Basically, all nurse practitioners must first have a registered nursing degree (RN). Once they have this degree they can apply for a Nurse Practitioner program at a university. It takes approximately 8 years of college to obtain an FNP license. FNP's can treat, diagnose, and order labs and other tests. Student Miana Zapata is a senior at Schreiner University working on her public health intership on Mondays and Wednesdays and is supervised by Raphael clinic FNP Margarita. She also helps out with the clinic's diabetes program.
